Year overview

- ❖ Total enrollments: 305
- ❖ Positive exits:165 (shelter, tiny homes, PRK, PHK, reunifications)
- ❖ Total Referred to Tiny Home Villages: 25
- ❖ Referrals to RRH: 20 (low availability in SPA 8)
- ❖ Referred to PRK: 340 (tier 1 referrals)
- ❖ Rapid & Recovery Rehousing referrals to new vouchers: 73
- ❖ Total assisted with CDBG (thank you SD4): 28 individuals
- ❖ Enrolled into case management currently: 111

Success Story

- Eugene was previously experiencing homelessness for about 2 years in the city of Wilmington after being released from prison. Outreach team came across Eugene through a LA-HOP request. Based on his high acuity score and disability status, he received a CES matching placement. Eugene's South Bay COG case manager collaborated with Housing Works to complete housing application documentation needed for Eugene to move in, as well as with rental assistance. Eugene now lives in a one-bedroom apartment subsidized housing unit in the city of Compton, CA and stated "I could have never done this alone. Thank you".



Success Story

- Tina and Mary are mother and daughter who were previously experiencing homelessness in the city of Redondo Beach. With the assistance of COG and Recovery Rehousing collaboration, Mother and Daughter were able to move into permanent housing in the city of Hawthorne. They now live in a 1-bedroom apartment where they expressed “feels like a miracle to be in”.

Future Considerations

- More affordable permanent resources in each city (Prevents city jumping)
- Consideration of utilizing COG Funds for interim housing solutions
 - Tiny Home Village
 - A Bridge Home
 - Shelters (longer term)
 - Meal programs within each cities
