SUBJECT:	South Bay Measure M Multi-Year Sub-Regional Programs Initial 5-Year Project Approvals, Funding Plans

Adherence to Strategic Plan:

Goal A: Environment, Transportation, and Economic Development. Facilitate, implement, and/or educate members and others about environmental, transportation, and economic development programs that benefit the South Bay. Strategy 5 – Actively pursue opportunities for infrastructure funding for member agencies.

Background

The Measure M expenditure plan includes three South Bay sub-regional funding programs: Highway Efficiency and Operational Improvements Program (HEOIP) and two Transportation System Mobility Improvement Programs (TSMIP #1 and TSMIP #2). The Measure M Guidelines require an initial five-year project list for each of three South Bay Multi-Year Sub-Regional Programs to be approved by the sub-region and the Metro Board of Directors. The funding plans must be constrained by Metro's projected cash flow available to each of the programs over the five years.

The SBCCOG has been working with potential South Bay lead agencies since last September developing the initial five-year funding allocation programs. Following development of selection criteria, project performance monitoring requirements and project application instructions, the SBCCOG administered a call for projects from potential lead agencies.

The application included a description of the project, total project cost, MSP funding requested, project schedule and cashflow schedule for the reimbursements being requested. Applicants were also required to submit documentation of City Council approval of the project and letters of concurrence from adjacent jurisdictions for projects that include rights-of-way or supporting actions from responsible agencies.

SBCCOG convened a project evaluation panel representing South Bay public works and transit staff and SBCCOG staff. Thirty-seven applications were submitted by 12 public agencies. The requests total \$13.05 million in HEIO, \$28.74 million in TSMIP #1, and \$83.38 million in

TSMIP #2 for a grand total of \$125.17 million. In addition to the projects, SBCCOG will include 0.5% of the Measure M funding (\$1.13 million) for administration and program development over the five-year period. Since the total Measure M available for all three MSP programs is approximately \$225.07 million over the five-year period, there will be approximately \$98.77 million available for contingencies and additional project investments during the initial five-year period.

The panel members individually evaluated each application and discussed each of their initial evaluations in a group meeting. Of the 37 applications, the panel recommended creating the following categories with the projects sorted as follows:

- 1. TIER 1 includes 24 project applications ready for Steering Committee consideration at this meeting. Because the SBCCOG Board will not meet in February, the Steering Committee is delegated authority to act as the Board to approve these projects
- 2. TIER 2 includes 6 project applications for which the evaluation panel has requested lead agencies to make revisions in the application and cashflow spreadsheet and/or submit letters from their Board and responsible adjacent jurisdictions. In addition, projects were placed in Tier 2 if their initial reimbursements are requested in later years of the five-year program. SBCCOG staff expects to bring the Tier 2 projects to the SBCCOG Transportation Committee and SBCCOG Board in March 2019.
- 3. DEFERRED PROJECTS 3 projects were deferred to a future South Bay MSP Call for Projects without prejudice to allow the lead agencies to further coordinate with outside agencies as needed; further refine the scope and/or cost of the application; or to confirm whether other funding sources are available for some or all elements of their proposed projects (e.g.: park funds, Metro rail development funds, stormwater funds, State or Federal funds, etc.).
- 4. INELIGIBLE AND PROJECTS WITHDRAWN from the list include three (3) applications that are ineligible because their scope only included sidewalk repair or pavement rehabilitation / repair and 1 project was withdrawn by the lead agency from consideration and will be considered for Measure R South Bay Highway Program funding.

Exhibit A is organized to assign the 37 applications into one of the four categories.

- 1. Tier 1 projects
- 2. Tier 2 projects
- 3, Deferred projects
- 4, Ineligible / Withdrawn projects

Due to the 5-year funding limitations within the TSMIP #1 funding program, SBCCOG staff reassigned several of the projects that initially applied for TSMIP #1 funds to TSMIP #2. The only difference between TSMIP #1 and TSMIP #2 funding is that TSMIP #1 funding expires in 2032. The reallocation ensures that requests do not exceed the five-year cumulative funding available within each of the three programs.

Exhibit B is the projected funding required to reimburse lead agencies as they implement the recommended Tier 1 and Tier 2 projects.

Next steps

SBCCOG staff will continue to work with lead agencies to complete revisions on Tier 2 project applications. Staff will return in March to the Transportation Committee and SBCCOG Board for approval of additional Tier 2 projects.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Transportation Committee recommend hat the Steering Committee:

- 1. Approve the 24 Tier 1 projects listed in Exhibit A;
- 2. Receive and File the initial assignment of the remaining 13 project applications to the other three tiers; and
- 3. Receive and File Exhibit B, the initial 5-year cashflow spreadsheet.
