

South Bay Broadband Feasibility Study

- Study and Executive Summary on website
- Series of Brown Bag lunches to learn more about the technology and applications – next one August 23
- Additional funding from So Bay Workforce Investment Board and request to Board of Supervisors for funding to do the preparation for an RFP to get actual costs and commitments



- Dedicated community outreach program specific to the South Bay provided by People Assisting the Homeless (PATH)
- Funded by Supervisors Hahn & Ridley-Thomas through June 30, 2018
- SBCCOG to be funded for city coordination starting around September
