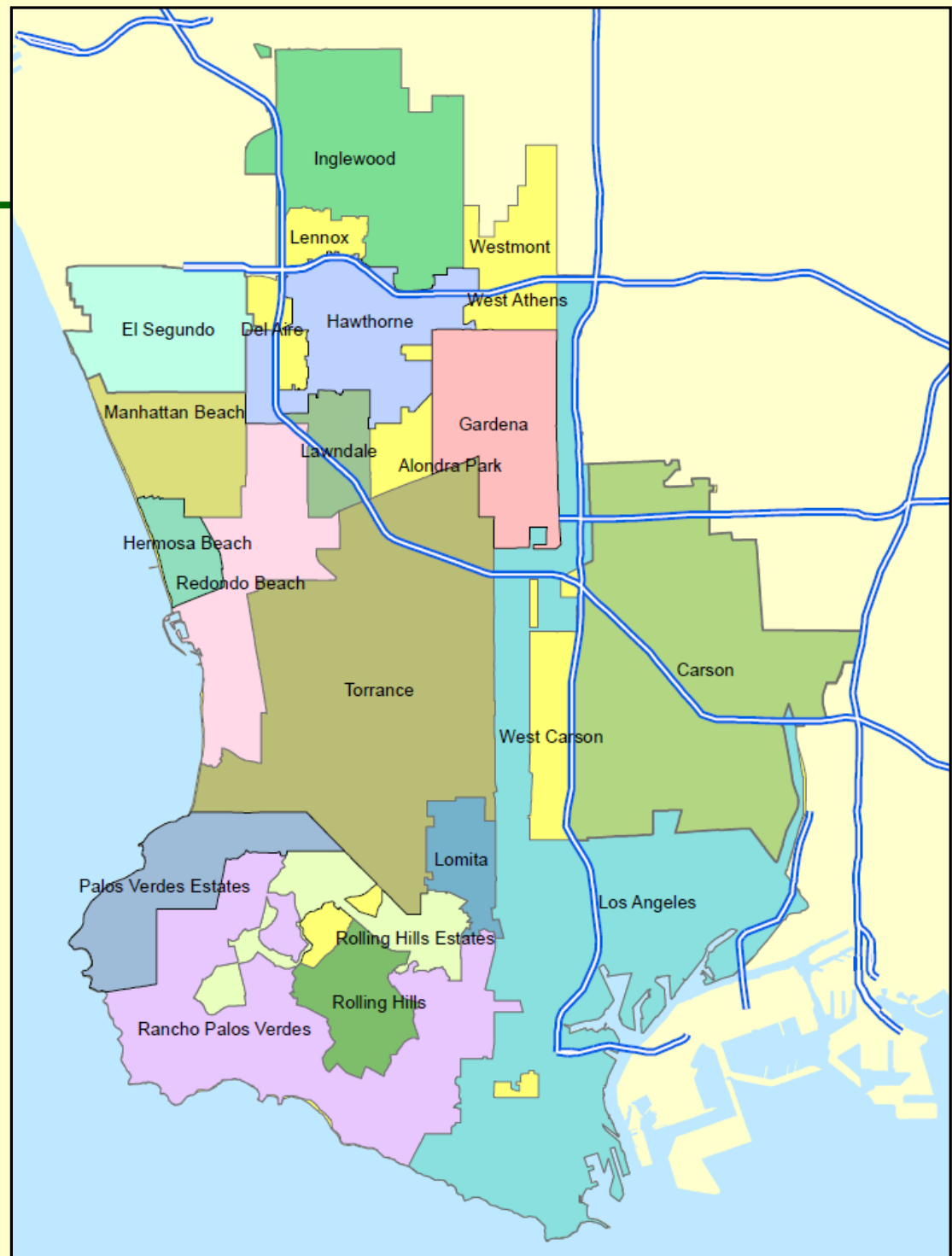

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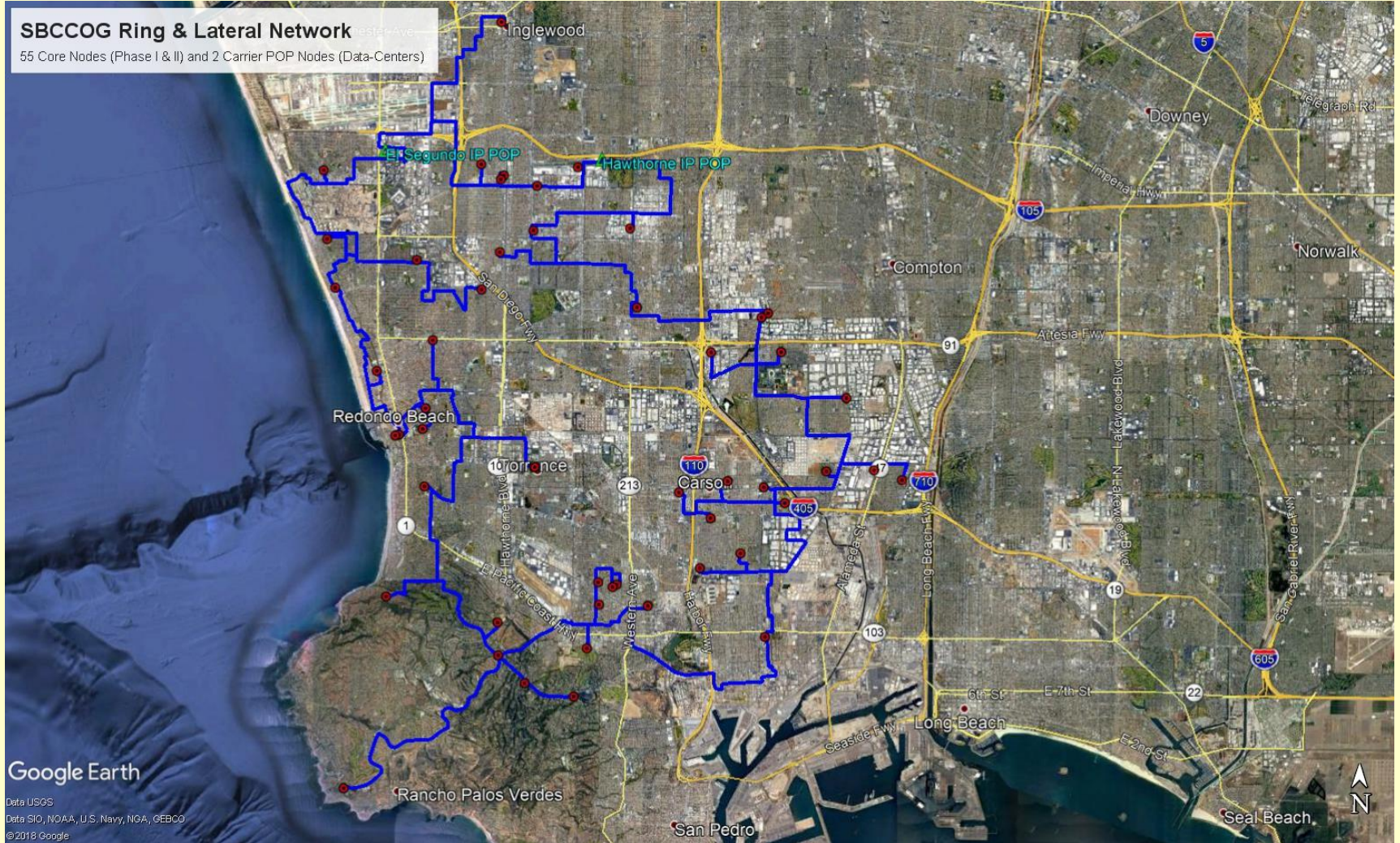

# South Bay Fiber Network

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- Agreement signed with Metro for all capital costs Phase 1 from SBCCOG's Measure M Subregional funds.
- Participating agencies: all 15 cities, BCHD, LABioMed, SBWIB, LA Metro, LA County DPW
- Minimum service - \$1000/mo for 1 gigabit.
- All agencies will be connected to real time traffic information
- Negotiating final agreement with ADF

- Funding in the State budget for the South Bay Fiber project \$1.2 million!!!



# Measure R and Measure M

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SBCCOG cities and agencies applied for projects to improve and/or implement: ITS and signal synchronization, intersections (such as turn lanes), and bicycle/pedestrian safety and accessibility.

- Measure R
  - 13 new projects totaling over \$37 M approved by Metro at the end of June
  
- Measure M
  - Initial 5-year plan of projects was approved by Metro at the end of September
    - 25 projects totaling over \$115 M

# Homeless Services for the South Bay - Highlights

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- More affordable housing is needed through the South Bay region! Two projects in City of LA CD 15: LINC Housing is in the planning phase of 56-unit Senior Housing in Wilmington. Hope on 6<sup>th</sup> in San Pedro is a proposed 49-unit supportive and affordable housing building. Awaiting full City Council approval for HHH funding.
- New Sanitation Strategy in City of LA implemented on October 1<sup>st</sup>. A CARE team – sanitation, water shed protection, and LAHSA – deployed in every LA City Council District to conduct regular trash pickup, provide regular maintenance and sanitation around encampments.
- The next Housing & Health Resources Fair will be held on October 23<sup>rd</sup> in Carson at Dominguez Park. Showers will be available. SBCCOG confirmed participation of DMV, Public Defender's Criminal Record Clearing Project, and California Water Services – will provide water and collapsible water bottles for event.



# Homeless Services for the South Bay - Highlights

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- The next meeting of the SBCCOG Homeless Services Task Force is November 6<sup>th</sup>. City of Redondo Beach is hosting.
- The SBCCOG hosts Assembly Member Muratsuchi's Homeless Action Group meetings.
- Measure H Policy Summits for Fiscal Years 2020-21, 2021-22, and 2022-23. Partnership with Cities Policy Summit on November 7<sup>th</sup>, with representation from SBCCOG, Redondo Beach, and Torrance.
- 7 SBCCOG-member cities have completed homelessness plans, with 5 cities receiving Measure H implementation funding – Beach Cities (Hermosa Beach, Manhattan Beach, Redondo Beach), Hawthorne, and Inglewood.



# Homeless Services for the South Bay - Highlights

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- Plans have started for the 2020 SPA 8 Point In Time Homeless Count – January 22, 2020.
- Last month, the Board of Supervisors allocated \$6 million to the COGs to help cities address and combat homelessness. The SBCCOG is will receive \$739,685. We are working on plans to use these funds. Shared housing pilot will be one possible program. Funding cycle is expected to be February 2020-June 30, 2021.

# Senior Services

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- Work continues on South Bay Cities becoming part of the AARP Age-Friendly Network and the South Bay becoming an Age-Friendly region.
- Statewide Master Plan on Aging (to be completed by October 2020) will add the entire state into the Livable Communities Movement.
- Each city will be required to use a lens of aging when reviewing General Plans.
- Hermosa Beach and Inglewood have started the process. On agenda in Rolling Hills Estates this month. Interest from El Segundo and Hawthorne.
