WHAT DOES THE SBCCOG DO FOR OUR MEMBERS? March 28, 2013

MOBILITY PROJECTS

Measure R - The South Bay Highway Program has committed approximately \$173 million in sub-regional Measure R funds for 50 South Bay highway and arterial projects and nearly \$19 million to begin 6 projects on South Bay freeways to upgrade our transportation system and improve South Bay mobility. A portion of these funds is being used for project study reports and other related items that allow projects to be ready for construction for which there were previously either no or insufficient funds.

In order to fund these specific projects, the SBCCOG has brought the cities and regional agencies together to develop the program selection criteria, administer the program and oversee the implementation process including the management of the technical consultant contract.

SBCCOG supplies consulting assistance for funding applications for Measure R projects as well as the local match of funds and letters of support.

Regional Transportation Projects - SBCCOG has provided technical and policy assistance and updates on the Crenshaw-LAX light rail project, Green Line South Extension rail project, LAX Connector project, and a range of transportation issues of interest to the SBCCOG.

Vanpool and ExpressLane Information — When Metro revised their vanpool guidelines, SBCCOG was able to provide input which insured that the vanpool subsidy revised guidelines will continue to incentivize South Bay vanpools.

TRANSPORTATION PLANNING

- SBCCOG funding has received approximately \$2 million over the past 10 years for planning and research. These external funds have been used to:
 - Conduct transportation and economic studies in 8 locations Riviera Village, Inglewood, Old Torrance, Torrance PCH, Gardena, Hawthorne, El Segundo, Redondo Beach.
 - Conduct economic feasibility study on Marine Ave. in Lawndale.
 - Ongoing economic feasibility studies in Gardena, Hermosa Beach and Lennox.
- Additional funding has been obtained to:
 - Conduct NEV (Neighborhood Electric Vehicle) demonstration projects serving 51 families in primarily in Redondo Beach, Torrance, Hermosa Beach and El Segundo.
 - Conduct ongoing BEV (Battery Electric Vehicle) demonstration projects serving 50 families still to be determined but expected to be located in PVP cities, Lawndale, Torrance, Hawthorne, Lomita, Gardena, Carson, and Manhattan Beach.
 - PEV (Plug In Vehicle) Readiness plans for every city. (Note there are 750 PEVs of some type in the South Bay today and at least 75,000 expected within the next 10 years. These plans address what cities need to know to accommodate the requirements of alternative fueled vehicles in their codes and at their counters.
 - Proposing a PEV demonstration in Inglewood.

ENVIRONMENTAL PROGRAMS SBESC

Audits & On-Call Energy Manager Service - With SBCCOG assistance, the South Bay Cities achieved overall municipal energy savings of 4 million kWh in electricity and 70,000 therms of gas usage exceeding our Southern California Edison and Gas Company contract goals. This meant that our cities received a total of \$594,768 in utility incentives and now

realize an annual ongoing reduction in energy costs of \$651,944 while also reducing greenhouse gas emissions by 3,550 tons of CO2e.

Resource Conservation in the Community

Energy Management Tool Development - Through a grant funded by Southern California Edison at no cost to the SBCCOG, the SBCCOG is setting up web portals for each participating municipality to view all utility cost and consumption data in a single location using a portfolio management approach. These tools once fully launched will enable city finance directors to easily audit utility bills for accuracy as well as cost variance analysis. They will set a benchmark and baseline for individual municipal facilities and allow city staff or the SBCCOG on behalf of individual cities to identify priority facilities for utility based cost savings projects.
