## IV. SBCCOG Transportation Working Group Updates

A. Infrastructure Working Group Update Mr. Semaan shared that the IWG will be meeting on Wednesday October 13<sup>th</sup>. He also shared that SBCCOG staff is currently meeting with city staff to review lead agency progress on current Measure R and Measure M projects and potential new Measure M projects.

## **B.** Transit Operators Working Group Update

Mr. Lee reported that the group met last week and heard updates on the Measure R and Measure M call for projects, as well as updates on the Measure R South Bay Transit Investment Program.

SBCCOG staff has also been working with Torrance Transit staff to look into including the Torrance Regional Transit Center in the South Bay Fiber Network.

# C. Metro Service Council

Mr. Szerlip reported that the Council did not have a quorum last month but heard updates on the 2022 customer outreach plan. This month, there were updates on the Metro Youth Council and NextGen implementation. There will be no in-person meetings through the end of the year.

## V. Caltrans District 7 South Bay Projects Update

Mr. Shih reported there were no updates since last month's meeting.

#### VI. Measure R and Measure M Metro Budget Request Updates A. Current Programs of Projects

Mr. Lantz reported that SBCCOG staff has been meeting with city staff to review the status of current Measure R and M projects and discuss new project ideas.

## VII. Metro Updates

Mr. Dierking reported that there are virtual walk-tours available for the C Line (Green Line) Extension to Torrance. Outreach remains virtual due to the pandemic, so Metro created story maps to provide a digital walking tour experience.

Mr. Lantz added that the Fareless System Initiative implementation continues. Phase 1 includes K-12 and community college students. Metro continues work to get additional school districts to participate. The pilot program is scheduled for a 20-month period and is being funded by federal funds provided in response to the pandemic.

#### VIII. Presentation: Manhattan Beach Advanced Traffic Signal Project Overview

Ms. Shi began by explaining that the Manhattan Beach Advanced Traffic Signal Project (MBATS) has received tremendous support from the SBCCOG, the Manhattan Beach school district, fire and police departments, Metro, SCAG, and others. The project aims to design and install a state-of-the-art traffic signal system that can be integrated into a broadband network. Ms. Shi then introduced the city's consultant, Alan Clelland with DKS, who went on to explain the project in more detail. MBATS will connect traffic signals to a high-speed fiber network to support emerging real-time traffic management technologies and data sharing. The upgraded signal system will also be able to support video detection, CCTV, dynamic message signs, and also prepares the city for connected vehicles.
