

COVID-19 Update







Changes to Indoor Masking


Low & Medium COVID-19 Community Levels with

weekly case rate <100 per 100,000

Lo	cation or Situation	Indoor Masking
•	Healthcare settings, long-term care settings and adult/senior care facilities, or in any other location where it is the policy of the business or venue. For 10 days after start of symptoms from COVID or positive test when eligible to end isolation and are returning to work or school, OR for 10 days after exposure to someone with COVID.	Required <i>no change</i>
•	Correctional facilities and shelters that have not had a recent outbreak On Public Transit and inside Transit Hubs: buses & bus stations, trains & train stations, airplanes & airports, taxis and rideshares.	Strongly Recommended May be required by agency
•	Individuals with higher risk*, when in higher-risk settings^	Strongly Recommended
•	All other indoor public settings, businesses and government offices	Individual preference

*Individuals at elevated risk include: elderly, unvaccinated, those with underlying medical conditions, immunocompromised individuals, and those living in high poverty communities. A Higher-risk settings include any of the "three Cs" - Closed spaces with poor air flow, Crowded places with many people nearby, and Close contact settings especially where people are talking (or breathing heavily) close together.

How to Get Vaccinated

FIRST AND SECOND DOSES

Get your second dose at least 28 days after the first dose.



- Walk up to get vaccinated at a Public Health POD or other community site. See ph.lacounty.gov/Monkeypox for a list of sites.
- 2

Make an appointment at MyTurn.ca.gov to get vaccinated at a community partner or provider site.

NEW MINOR CONSENT POLICY

- Minors who are 12 through 17 Years of Age: Can receive the monkeypox vaccine without parental consent at Public Health vaccination sites (DPH Clinics and PODs).
- Minors who are 6 Months to 12 Years of Age: Must have parental consent and be accompanied by a parent, legal guardian, or a responsible adult.
