

Mayra was first encountered by PATH Outreach at Lomita/McCoy encampment in July 2021. Mayra was one of the first to enroll into Harbor City Tiny Home Village. She was eventually connected with ICMS. In collaboration with ICMS and the assistance of Emergency Housing Voucher, PATH was able to locate her permanent housing February 2023


Community Connections (continued)


- ➤ **Gardena Joint Outreach** Between PATH Outreach, Harbor Interfaith, LAHSA, and Mental Health America continue in attempts to service individuals experiencing homelessness in encampments
- > Joint Outreach with City Staff from Carson and Torrance have been established to better service individuals experiencing homelessness within each city's borders.
- Lawndale City officials and PATH worked together for joint efforts to identify locations where individuals are experiencing homelessness within the city. PATH has an established collaboration with LAHSA Outreach while City staff continue to provide support when needed.
- Department of Health Services Mobile Health Clinic team and PATH have continued to join forces to better assist individuals experiencing homelessness obtain Primary Care and Mental Health services. PATH outreach adjusts schedule in order to provide transportation, support, and assistance to individuals attending Mobile Health Clinic.

- County-wide, web-based portal
- Constituents can submit requests for outreach services
- Requests are routed to the appropriate regional coordinator
- The Region's Outreach Coordinator triages the request to the most appropriate outreach team
- The outreach team accepts the requests, deploys outreach services
