

Service Planning Area 8 Update – February 23, 2023

- 1. Hands Only CPR Training Availability: SPA 8 kicked off our Hands Only CPR (HOCPR) campaign on January 26, 2023. The DPH SPA8 Community Liaison team will provide training to those interested in this life-saving technique. Please note this is not a CPR certification training. - 2. Fentanyl Presentation and Naloxone Kit Procurement for Community: The DPH SPA8 Community Liaison (CL) team will provide presentations and participate at community events to engage with community members regarding the dangers of Fentanyl use and how to respond to an overdose. If needed, the CL Team can also distribute naloxone kits and provide a training. 3. Los Angeles County Homelessness Emergency

The Department of Public Health is working on a number of efforts to address the Homelessness Emergency in LA County. Ongoing efforts consist of working with the Los Angeles County Chief Executive Office, Homeless Initiative (CEO-HI), local Homelessness Emergencies, increasing capacity and nimbleness in our PEH-serving activities and programs, and partnering with County departments to build technical assistance resources for interim housing operators to support connections to services for PEH in those facilities. Next steps will be focused on substance use led by our Substance Abuse Prevention and Control (SAPC) Program. SAPC is building its field-based capacity, both in terms of their Client Engagement and Navigation Services (CENS) and field-based SUD treatment for PEH. The CENS provides screening and linkage to treatment and is therefore expanding capacity to address the high need. SAPC's contracted network of treatment providers have the ability to provide field-based outpatient treatment. SAPC is now working with the LAC CEO, partner departments, LAHSA, and homeless services providers to identify where and when SAPC's provider network will be deployed.

- **4. AAIMM:** The South Los Angeles/South Bay African American Infant and Maternal Mortality (AAIMM) in partnership with WIN Los Angeles will be hosting a Black History Month community resource fair on Friday, February 24th from 10am to 2pm at the Breath of Life Seventh Day Adventist Church in Inglewood. Attendees will receive produce, baby essentials, along with vital resources at the event. Please feel free to share this event amongst your networks, see attached flyer.
- 5. COVID-19 Update: Due to the decreasing number of COVID cases, hospitalizations and deaths, the Federal and State governments have announced the end of their COVID emergencies. The Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors have not set a date for the end of the County emergency but once it is announced we will make sure to inform our partners. 6. Curtis Tucker Center for Community Wellness Programming: Our Center for Community Wellness (CCW) located in Inglewood recently added a second monthly food distribution for the community. These events take place the 2nd Thursday and 4th Tuesday of each month. The distribution events on the 2nd Thursday consist of pantry staples like canned goods while the events on the 4th Tuesday consist of distributing fresh produce (see attached flyers). Additionally, we have partnered with the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) to host a family support group on the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of the month from 6pm to 7:30pm, starting March 2023.




