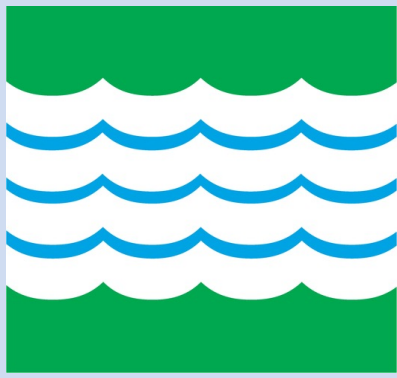
South Bay Fiber Network



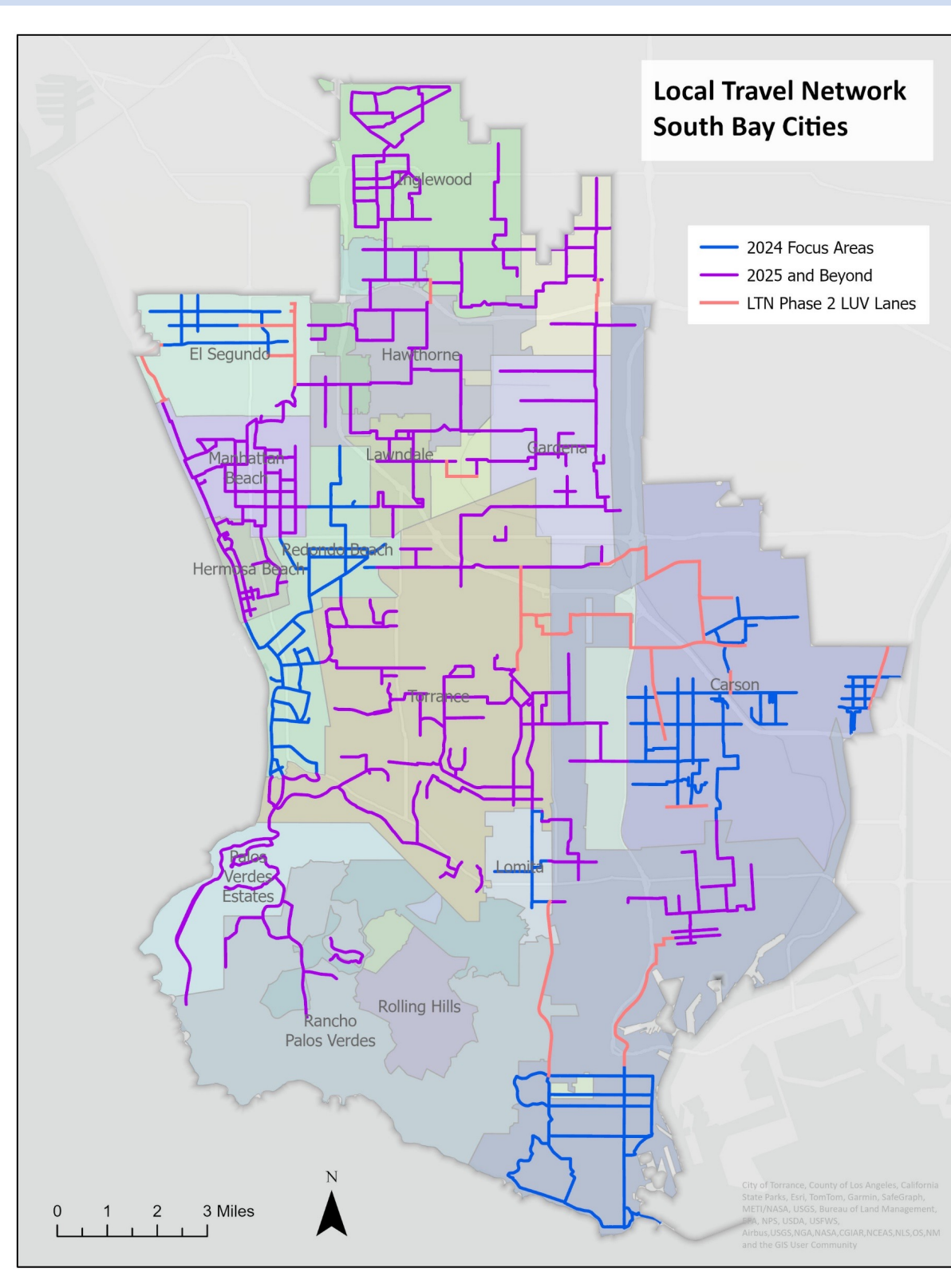


South Bay Fiber Network

- SBFN - 43 sites connected
- Service remains reliable with competitive pricing
- Meeting with local ISPs to develop expansion plans
- Federal and state grants terminated or suspended
 - Exploring alternative funding
- Leveraging the SBFN for other SBCCOG projects
 - Commercial Redevelopment
 - Mobility Hubs



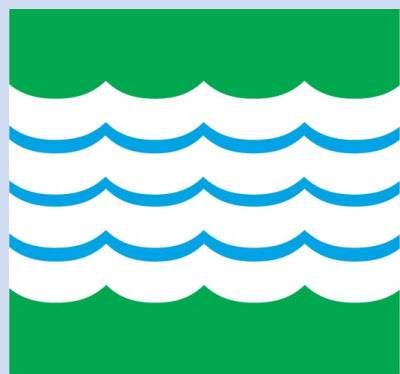
Local Travel Network



- Implemented in El Segundo
- Redondo Beach LTN implementation this fall
- NEW two-year LTN consultant bench
 - Lomita, Carson, El Segundo (expansion),
Lawndale design in progress
- Carson to the Sea project gap analysis underway
- SS4A grant awaiting contract execution

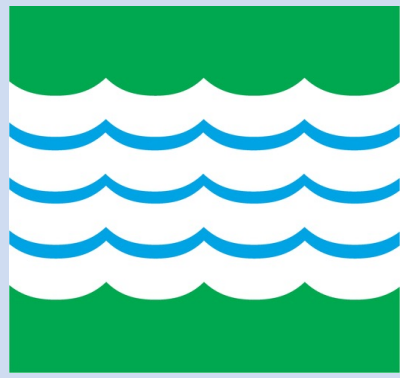




South Bay Transportation Projects

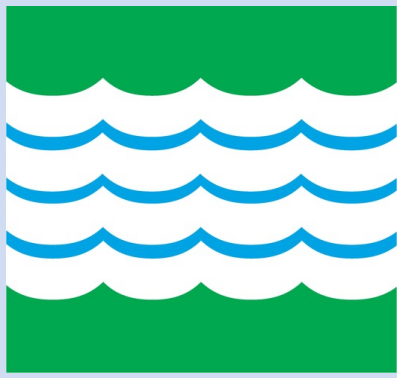
- **June 2025:** \$2.6 million in additional Measure R Highway Program funding for 3 projects approved by Metro Board
- **September 2025:** Anticipate approval of \$9.45 million in additional Measure R Transit Investment Program funding for 2 projects by Metro Board
- **September 2025:** Anticipate approval of \$78 million in additional Measure M funding for 26 projects by Metro Board





Local Allocation Program

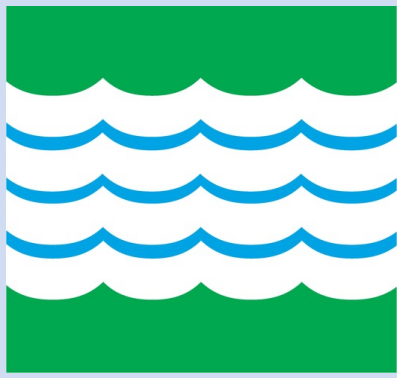
- The Local Allocation Program (LAP) is a new program funded through a 10% allocation of Measure M MSP funds available each year to each SBCCOG member agency by a formula (SBCCOG dues + centerline roadmiles). The set-aside will begin with FY29-30 revenue.
- The LAP is intended to maintain geographic equity in the Measure M subregional program and to allow cities with low staff capacity to have reliable access to funding.



Field Trip to New LAX/Metro Transit Center

The 500,000 square foot LAX/MTC is the first Measure M project to open since voters approved the initiative in 2016. In early August, the SBCCOG staff, board members and partners took a field trip ride the Metro K line from Redondo Beach to the LAX/MTC. Nearly 40 people attended.

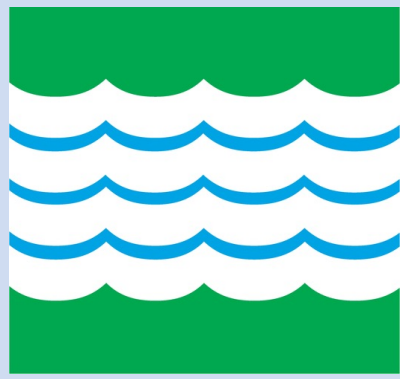




Homeless Services in the South Bay – Highlights



- Received CALCOG award for Functional Zero and Client Aid programs
 - Client Aid just-in-time money, has 87% success rate and just an average cost of \$1,200 per client
 - 4 Cities in Fzero Program
- LA County Homeless agency re-org being monitored in coalition w/ other COGs
- SBCCOG has signed Measure A Local Solutions Fund and LACAHSa contract
- Homeless count going down in South Bay- 13% annual decline. Just 900 street homeless in our 15 cities. Lower per capita rate than national average.



Housing Programs in the South Bay – Highlights



REAP 2.0 (SCAG)

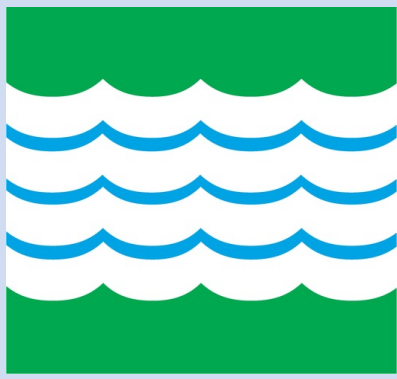
South Bay Regional Housing Trust: currently developing a strategic plan including staffing plan, funding programs, and other key elements necessary for cities to consider before deciding to join

REAP 2.0 (SCAG)

Commercial Redevelopment into Housing: Currently meeting with participating cities about city selected sites. Following is fit and feasibility studies and conceptual design of different housing typologies

REAP 2.0 (Metro)

Micromobility Hubs: Work about to begin on a study of potential mobility hub sites. Mobility hubs in the South Bay will promote micromobility and address the gaps in transit throughout the sub region

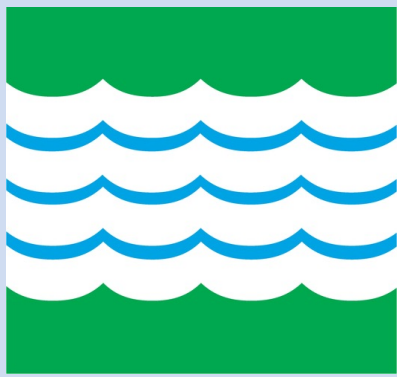


Environmental Programs - SBESC

Environmental information & access to resources for agencies, residents, & businesses

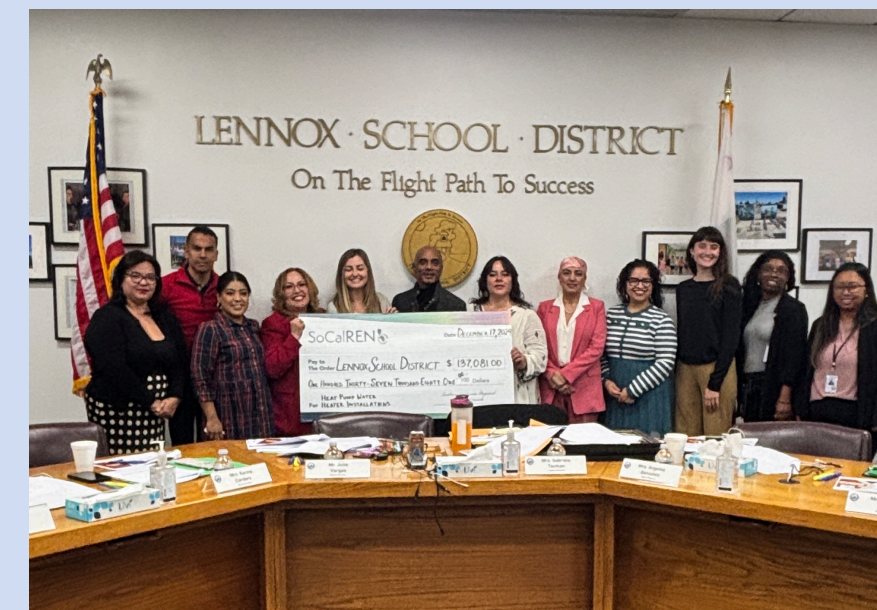
- **Outreach** – Connecting with the community at over 100 events per year
- **Water Programs** – Partnering with West Basin, WRD, and LADWP providing water saving information, devices, and rebates to residents & businesses
 - Connecting cities and schools to water bottle filling station rebates
- **CA Green Business Network (CAGBN)** Certification – Starting outreach to businesses to help them access resources to become more sustainable and certified as a "Green Business"
- **SBCCOG Green Business Assist Program** – Over 400 business locations certified

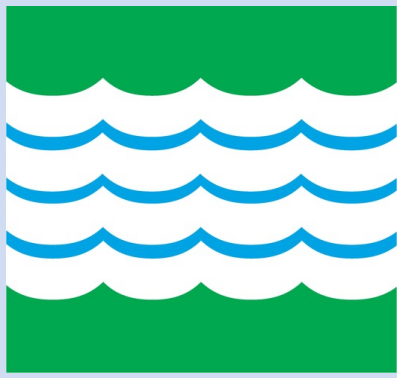




Environmental Programs - SBESC

- **Energy Efficiency Upgrades** – In partnership with SoCalREN, identifying municipal and school building upgrades through site visits, energy engineer assessments, and public incentives
- **Students and teachers** – Enrolled three school districts - around 60 classrooms - of 3rd and 4th graders in the South Bay in the Kits for Kids program for Fall 2025. Continuing school district staff bulletins
- **City Recognition** – Year three of the South Bay Energy & Climate Recognition Program is under way, celebrating our cities for their sustainability projects and fostering healthy competition
- **Innovative Technology** – Working with a consultant on a feasibility study of cool roof technologies
- **Commercial Direct Install** – Conducting site audits for hard-to-reach and low-income low-access businesses in Gardena to get energy efficiency upgrades for free paid for by LA County. 16 out of 30 projects active as of August totaling \$260,000 in project costs to cover new water heaters, lighting, and refrigeration
- **Greenhouse Gas Inventories** – 2019-2020 municipal and communitywide inventories in the process of finalization with city staff

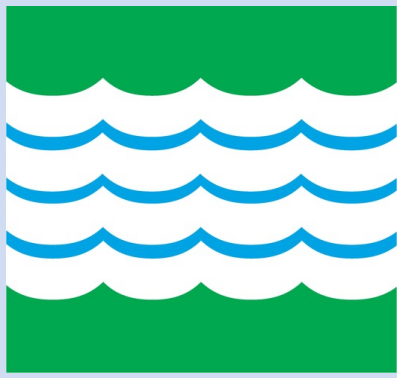

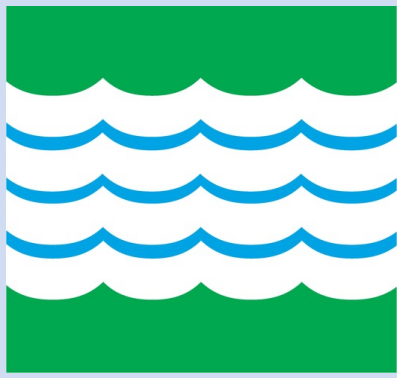

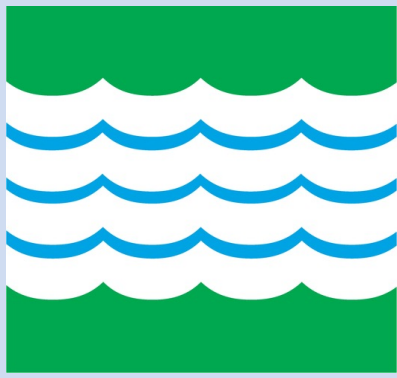
